The estimated cost will be around \$375 for youth and \$475 for adults, which includes air-conditioned rooms, meals, transportation, course materials and handouts, patches, and more.

Remember that your Boy Scouts of America registration must be current and we must have your Scout ID# for you to be a member of the Order of the Arrow.

Status Codes and Dues Amounts:

1. Tecumseh Lodge YOUTH (20 or younger) members who paid their 2010 dues may renew by paying **\$10.00**.
2. Tecumseh Lodge ADULT (21 or older) members who paid their 2010 dues may renew by paying **\$15.00**.
3. Tecumseh Lodge YOUTH members who are not current with their 2010 dues may reinstate their membership by paying **\$15.00**.
4. Tecumseh Lodge ADULT members who are not current with their 2010 dues may reinstate their membership by paying **\$20.00**.
5. OA members transferring into Simon Kenton Council from another Council may do so by sending proof of current dues paid in the other Lodge and their Scout ID# along with **\$10.00** for youth or **\$15.00** for adults to transfer into Tecumseh Lodge.
6. OA members transferring into Simon Kenton Council from another Council with their OA dues not being current may do so by sending proof of membership in the other Lodge and their Scout ID# along with **\$15.00** for youth or **\$20.00** for adults to transfer into Tecumseh Lodge.
7. Tecumseh Lodge members on ACTIVE DUTY with any United States Military Branch during the current year may maintain their paid dues status free of charge. (This does not apply to local duty in connection with the Reserves or National Guard)
