ABOUT THE ORDER OF THE ARROW

HISTORY

The Order of the Arrow was founded by Dr. E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson in 1915 at the Treasure Island Camp of the Philadelphia Council, Boy Scouts of America. It became an official program experiment in 1922 and was approved as part of the Scouting program in 1934. In 1948 the OA, recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers, became an official part of the Boy Scouts of America. In 1998, the Order of the Arrow became recognized as Scouting's National Honor Society when it expanded its reach beyond camping to include broader service to Scouting and the community. In 2012 Young Women were accepted to join the Order of the Arrow.

PURPOSE

The Order of the Arrow was founded in 1915 to serve a useful purpose: to cause the Scout Oath and Law to spring into action in all parts of the nation. To this day, the Order is dedicated to this high purpose.

MISSION AND PURPOSE

For more than 90 years, the Order of the Arrow (OA) has recognized Scouts and Scouters who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives. This recognition provides encouragement for others to live these ideals as well. Arrowmen are known for maintaining camping traditions and spirit, promoting year-round and long term resident camping, and providing cheerful service to others. OA service, activities, adventures, and training for youth and adults are models of quality leadership development and programming that enrich and help to extend Scouting to America's youth.

The Order of the Arrow has over 170,000 members nationwide.

HOW THE ORDER OF THE ARROW IS ORGANIZED

The Order of the Arrow has three distinct organizational levels; lodges, sections, and regions. Lodges carry out the Order of the Arrow program at the local level and are closely tied with Boy Scout Councils. Sections consist of several lodges within a geographic region and Regions in turn consist of Sections within a geographic region of the United States. Lodges, Sections, and Regions each have a distinct set of responsibilities which ensure that the OA program runs smoothly.

At the national level, the Order of the Arrow is governed by the national Order of the Arrow committee. The national committee sets policy, directs the national program of the Order, and broadly manages the organization above the local lodge level. The committee is composed of the national chief and national vice chief (and their immediate predecessors), who are elected annually at the national planning meeting; the chairman, who is appointed annually by the chairman of the national Outdoor Adventures committee; other volunteer members, appointed by the chairman; and two staff members, the director of the Order of the Arrow and the OA specialist.

Regions

The Order of the Arrow, like the Boy Scouts of America, is organized into two geographical regions: Eastern Region and Gateway Region. Each region is led by a youth region chief, a volunteer region chairman, and a region staff adviser. The region leadership helps execute the national program on a more local level, implements the National Leadership Seminar and National Lodge Adviser Training Seminar, provides its member sections with resources, and facilitates communication between local organizations and the national OA committee.

Sections

An Order of the Arrow section consists of lodges within a geographic area of the region. Each section is led by a chief, vice chief, and secretary, who play a crucial part in making the annual Conclave a success. The section may lead training seminars, promote national programs of emphasis, and provide resources to local lodges. The section chief presides over the Council of Chiefs, attended by delegates of each member lodge.

Where does Tecumseh Lodge fit in?

Tecumseh lodge is part of **Section E13** in the **Eastern Region**.

During the year we will have two or three functions where we are directly involved with the other Lodges in our Section.

The Section Conclave is a gathering of the Lodges in the Section. It is hosted by a different Lodge each year, who will choose one of their camps to showcase. At the Conclave there will be training and competitions along with activities just to have fun and fellowship.

FORUM, the Area Leadership Training Conference, is a training session held by Section E13. It is hosted each November by Tecumseh Lodge at Camp Lazarus. This is a great training opportunity for those interested in furthering their involvement in the Lodge by becoming a Lodge officer or a Chapter officer.

NOAC is a gathering of all the Lodges in the country and is held every two or three years.

YOU AND YOUR UNIT

An Arrowman's primary responsibility is to his troop or post. Remember, it was your fellow scouts or explorers who elected you into our noble order, and it is to them that you should devote most of your service. Dr. E. Urner Goodman, founder of the Order, once said, "*Let it be remembered that the Order of the Arrow was created to help the unit - to help it present its membership a better idea of the inner qualities of the honor scout camper.*"

Qualities of character, like cheerfulness and service, are hard for a boy or a man to understand in the abstract. They come easier when seen in human life.

The Order was started to help glorify these qualities of the honor Scout Camper in the unit, so that they might be appreciated there, not only during the brief term in summer camp, but through all of the days and weeks of the year."

Let us remember the significance of the Order in the unit - for the unit is our one best hope in Scouting..."

What are your responsibilities in your home unit? You should make sure that your unit maintains an active camping program and that as many members as possible are involved. Be sure your lodge camp promotion team visits your unit at least once a year and that you have an annual Order of the Arrow election. Your unit should help the lodge give service to as many community projects as possible. It is also most important that you keep your unit members informed on current happenings of the lodge and in the local council.

YOUR RELATION TO YOUR UNIT

Always remember that your fellow Scouts honored you by electing you to the Order because of your Scout Spirit and camping ability. They set you apart as one from whom they expect a great deal. Your experience with the Ordeal should now enable you to give the leadership they want and need. For this reason, your first duty as an Arrowman is to continue and expand your service to your own unit. The success of the Order in your unit mainly depends on what you do individually. Your example of cheerful service in camp and at troop or post meetings is the spark that brings the spirit alive.

By striving to fulfill your Obligation you will not only help your fellow Scouts, you will also gain the experience needed to understand the Brotherhood membership.

THE JOURNEY FROM ORDEAL MEMBERSHIP TO BROTHERHOOD

Your completion of the Ordeal sets you on the next part of your long and toilsome journey; at least 6 full months of active preparation for sealing your membership in the Brotherhood Ceremony.

The Ordeal has introduced you to the mysteries of the Arrow. Now, during your service as an Ordeal member, you have ample opportunity to increase your knowledge of the Arrow and make it work for you.

The following gives all the basic information you will need during this important time. Your brothers in the Order also stand ready to help and you should take advantage of their support whenever possible.

The Challenges of Ordeal Membership

You must meet five challenges before you can enter the Circle of Brotherhood. The first of these you should meet now. The next three require steady effort over a period of many months. The last challenge you must meet after you are satisfied that you are meeting the first four.

1. Memorize the signs of Arrow Membership. Memorize the Obligation of the Order which you received from Allowat Sakima (printed on the back of your membership card). Also, memorize the Order of the Arrow song, the Admonition, the Sign of Ordeal Membership, and the Arrow handclasp.

2. Advance in your understanding of the Ordeal. Gain a thorough understanding of the Ordeal through which you have passed. Obtain a copy of the *Manual for the Ordeal*, or attend other Ordeal Ceremonies and learn more about what you have experienced.

3. Serve your Unit. Retain your registration in Scouting. During a period of at least 10 months, strive to fulfill your Obligation by continuing and expanding your service to your own Troop or Post.

4. Plan for service to your Lodge. Retain your registration in the Order of the Arrow Lodge and keep your dues paid. Be aware that acceptance of Brotherhood membership involves a pledge of service to the lodge. Develop a concrete idea of how you plan to fulfill this pledge.

5. Review your Progress. When you earnestly feel that you have met the four challenges above, write a letter to the Brotherhood Chairman. In this letter:

A. Explain what you think the Obligation means.

B. Describe how you have been fulfilling this Obligation in your troop or post and in your daily life, and how you have used your understanding of the Ordeal to aid in this service.

C. Describe your specific plans for giving service in the lodge program.

The Legend of the Order of the Arrow

Years ago, in the dim ages, In the Valley of the Delaware, Lived a peaceful tribe of Indians
- Lenni Lenape their name was. Deer and bear, wildcat and panther
through the forest oft they hunted. On the bosom of the river Peacefully they fished and
paddled.

Round their busy village wigwams still the chase they nimbly followed. In this state of bliss
so happy Many moons they lived contented, Springtime blossomed into summer, Summer
into autumn ripened, Autumn died on winter's bosom; Thus the seasons in succession Never
ending seemed to pass on.

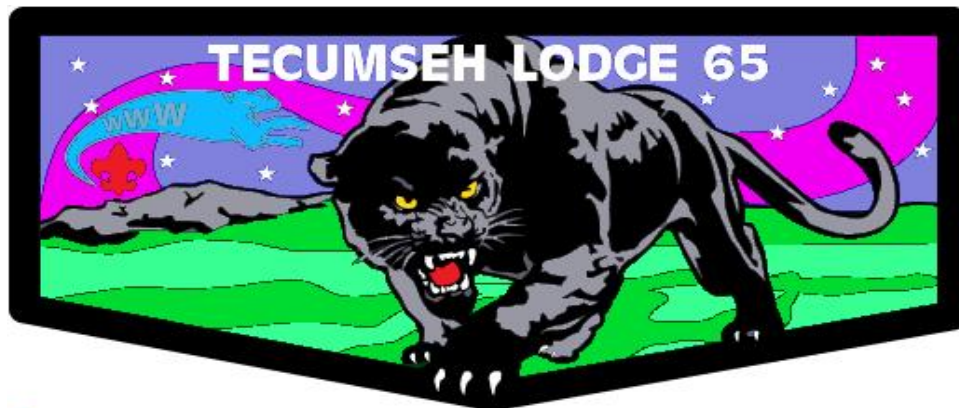
But, behold, a cloud arising Changed how soon this peaceful aspect. Neighboring tribes, and
distant enemies, Suddenly disturbed their hunting. Then Chingachgook, aged chieftain Of the
tribe, made quick inquiry: "Who will go and carry warning Of this dire and dreadful danger
To all Delawares, our brothers?" But none wished to make the journey.

Then spoke up the noble Uncas, Worthy son of the old chieftain, "O my father, I am ready;
Send me on this gracious errand. If we would remain a nation, we must stand by one another.
Let us both urge on our kindred firm devotion to our brethren and our cause, Ourselves
forgetting, Let us catch the higher vision. Let us find the greater beauty In the life of cheerful
service."

Off upon the trail they started, Old Chingachgook and young Uncas; And in every tribal
village Some were found who were quite willing To spend themselves in other's service. When
at last the fierce marauders Were forced back to their own country And peace was declared
between them, They who first themselves had offered For the service of their brethren, To the
places most respected By the chieftain were promoted: For, said he, who serves his fellows
Is, of all his fellows, greatest!

As a seed dropped by the sower On good soil bears quick fulfillment: So this saying of their
chieftain In their hearts found glad acceptance And they asked that in some manner He should
make its memory lasting.

So together fast and firmly Chief Chingachgook bound these warriors In a great and honored
Order, Into which can be admitted Only those who their own interests Can forget in serving
others. And so firm must be their purpose So to live that their companions, Taking note of their
devotion, Shall propose them to the Order, We, therefore, to them succeeding To the present
day perpetuate The names and tokens of this Brotherhood of Cheerful Service Called by
Delawares: Wimachtendienk - Wingolauchsik - Witahemui.



Our Lodge Emblem

The legend that is told of the birth of Tecumseh informs us that his father was looking for an omen. At the moment of the child's birth, a green comet, the color of a panther's eye, shot across the sky. Thus he was named, in the language of the Shawnee, Tecumseh. It's meaning "panther crossing across."

To represent this historic leader's birth, we have chosen the form of a panther-shaped comet. The flap of our Lodge shows the unsomo, or birth sign of the panther streaking across the sky at the moment of Tecumseh's birth. The twelve stars on the flap are representative of the twelve points of the Scout Law. The four stars to the left of the arrow represent the 4 lodges that came together to form Tecumseh Lodge: Katinonkwat, Kaniengehaga, Maka-Ina, and Shawnee. The red arrowhead and shaft are the symbol of our order, pointing on an ever upward path.

As the sign of our order the arrow has been fitly chosen, for the first arrow of the hunter must be sure. The shaft should be straight, its point ever keen. As such it becomes a token of leadership, and as such we adopt it. The three W's, as on all OA patches, stand for the name of the Order of the Arrow in Lenni Lenape, Wimachtendienk, Wingolauchsik, Witahemui.

Committee Descriptions

Each Committee should have a Chairman and an Adviser. Their job is to recruit enough help for each of our events so the events operate smoothly.

Brotherhood - Organizes and promotes every member in obtaining the Brotherhood honor. They will work with the Brotherhood candidates throughout the event.

Budgets - Works with all the other Committees to see that they create a reasonable budget and that they adhere to it.

Communications - Works to collect articles for publication the newsletter and on the Website. They will also send emails to our members to update them on events.

Conclave - Works to give our Lodge good representation at the Section Conclaves.

Elangomats - Recruits and organizes our Elangomat Teams to ensure our Candidates have a great Ordeal experience.

Unit Visitation - The Unit Visitation Committee works with the Chapters to ensure all elections are carried out properly and on time. They also should help the Chapters if needed.

Fellowships - Plans, organizes and promotes our Fellowships so the Lodge has a fun and memorable weekend.

Food Services - Helps plan the menu and recruits help for the Kitchen staff.

Honors - Organizes and administrates our awards, including the Vigil Honor weekend. they should also help organize and run our Awards Banquet.

Health and Safety - Works to see that all our events are run in a safe manner. They should also be trained for medical emergencies if needed.

Membership - Promotes membership retention by encouraging our new members to come back to our other events throughout the year. They should also encourage member to pay their dues at the beginning of the Lodge year.

NOAC - Organizes and plans our trips to NOAC. They should help promote NOAC throughout the year and take care of the administration duties required for NOAC.

Ceremonies - Recruits, organizes and trains the members of our Ceremony team. They need to see that our Ceremonie teams are present at our events and ready to perform on time.

Registration - Works at the beginning of our events to register our members and Candidates as they arrive. They need to recruit enough help to make registration run efficiently and quickly.

Reverence - The Reverence Committee Chairmen is to be responsible for ensuring that all events have engaging and informative interfaith worship services to promote reverence in the Lodge.

Service -

Trading Post - transports and operates our Trading post for each of our events. They should maintain the inventory levels to see that we have product available and should help make decisions on what merchandise we should carry in the Trading Post.

Admonition - The Admonition Committee will prepare and provide safe spaces for the people of the lodge. The committee will meet to discuss and improve the diversity, equity, and inclusion of the lodge.

Chapter of Excellence Award:

We are very excited to announce the implementation of the new Chapter of Excellence Award program for 2023. We hope that the new program will help the chapters, and by extension the lodge, improve in many of the PMP scoring areas. These requirements are very difficult, so chapters who complete the requirements will have a pizza party provided by the Lodge at a chapter meeting. In order to earn the award, a chapter must successfully complete at least 7 of the criteria.

1: *Membership Impact*: Experience positive growth in membership over the previous year. Increase total chapter membership by 7% over the previous year.

2: *Membership Retention*: Experience positive growth in membership. Have at least 50% of chapter members who took their Ordeal the previous year pay their current dues.

3: *Unit Election/Visitation*: Conduct unit election/visitation in all units within the district. Complete unit election/visitation in at least 90% of units, and turn in all results by March 15.

4: *Ordeal Completion*: Induct Ordeal candidates. Have at least 70% of Ordeal candidates complete their Ordeal.

5: *Brotherhood Completion*: Convert eligible Ordeal candidates to Brotherhood. Have at least 40% of eligible members complete their Brotherhood.

6: *Service Projects*: Complete service projects on scout property and in the community. Hold at least one chapter service project (minimum of 50 total service hours) and turn in service hour tracking sheets to the lodge; or staff a district event with at least 10 chapter members and turn in service hour tracking sheets to the lodge.

7: *Chapter Meetings*: Conduct regular chapter meetings. Hold at least 6 chapter meetings with no fewer than 5 youth members at each.

8: *LEC Attendance and Reports*: Have chapter represented at LEC meetings. Have a youth representative present at all LEC meetings (one miss allowed). In addition, present an oral report and submit a written report at every LEC.

9: *T-speaks Articles*: Inform OA members about your chapter. Have an article in all issues of Tecumseh Speaks (one miss allowed).

10: *Lodge Participation*: Maintain a presence in the Lodge. Have at least 20% of chapter members, including a minimum of 5 youth, attend either the Spring Fellowship or Fall Fellowship (attendance required is based on 15% of the total membership at the end of the previous year).

Gold Arrowman Award



We are excited to announce an award that is being offered to all our members. The Gold Arrowman is an award designed to recognize members that are active in the Lodge and promote the OA in their units. This award is designed to be earned during the course of one calendar year. First year recipients of this award will receive a unique lodge flap at our annual awards banquet. For those who earn it in subsequent years, you will receive a pin to add to the flap. In order to receive the Gold Arrowman award you need to complete the five requirements listed below, get them initialed, then sign and turn in the form.

Complete all five of the following requirements:

1. Attend one Training event (LLD or FORUM)
2. Do one of the Following:
 - A. For Ordeal candidates (new members who take their Ordeal in 2023), complete your Ordeal and Serve at one other Ordeal (Elangomat, Kitchen, Ritual, Chairman or Officer/Adviser)
 - B. For Ordeal members who took their Ordeal prior to 2023, earn Brotherhood and serve at one other Ordeal (Elangomat, Kitchen, Ritual, Chairman or Officer/Adviser)
 - C. For Brotherhood/Vigil Members – Serve at two Ordeals as an Elangomat, Kitchen help, Ritual team member, Lodge Committee/Chairman or as a Lodge Officer/Adviser
3. Attend one Fellowship (Spring/Fall)
4. Discuss Opportunities Within the Lodge with an Officer/Adviser
5. Talk to your unit about the opportunities within the OA and encourage inactive members to attend a Lodge event

OTHER AWARDS

The Order of the Arrow provides opportunities for its members to excel and be recognized for their accomplishments. These recognitions are provided at two levels of the organization, either at the local lodge level or at the National level. Individual members may be recognized or entire lodges. The awards and honors provided here are standard throughout the organization. Individual lodges may form and provide their own local awards such as “Brother of the Year”, “Most Active Arrowman”, and other achievement awards.

ARROWMAN SERVICE AWARD

The purpose of the Arrowman Service Award (ASA) is to encourage Arrowmen to recommit themselves to the ideals of the Order, increase their level of service to their local unit and council.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

The Distinguished Service Award is presented to Arrowmen, youth and adult, who have rendered distinguished and outstanding service to the Order on a sectional, regional, or national basis.

E. URNER GOODMAN CAMPING AWARD

The E. Urner Goodman Award was established in 1969 as a tribute and testimonial to the Order’s founder, E. Urner Goodman. Its purpose is to encourage and challenge Order of the Arrow members and lodges to increase their effectiveness in promoting and increasing Scout camping in each council. Awards are presented to two outstanding lodges in each region annually. For a lodge to be eligible for consideration, the E. Urner Goodman Camping Award petition should be completed and forwarded with the lodge’s charter renewal application.

FOUNDER’S AWARD

Introduced at the 1981 National Order of the Arrow Conference, the Founder’s Award recognizes Arrowmen who have given outstanding service to their lodge. The award is reserved for an Arrowman who demonstrates that he or she personifies the spirit of selfless service, as advocated by founder E. Urner Goodman and cofounder Carroll A. Edson.

INNOVATION AWARD RECIPIENTS

The Order of the Arrow Innovation Award was established in 2012 to recognize chapters and lodges for developing creative and innovative solutions to challenges faced during the implementation of their annual program plans. Two awards in each Region are presented annually.

JOSH SAIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 1998 to honor the spirit and the memory of Josh Sain, a former National Vice Chief of the Order of the Arrow. The scholarships are provided to immediate past National and Regional Officers, and immediate past section chiefs upon completion of their successful service of their terms. All awards are selected on merit and based on performance in their respective roles and academic achievements while serving in one of the roles mentioned above.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Legacy of Servant Leadership Lifetime Achievement Award was created by the National Order of the Arrow Committee in 2002 to recognize the Order’s second and third generation “Founders” - Scouters who have built an enduring legacy to Scouting and the Order of the Arrow through a lifetime of cheerful service to others.

OTHER AWARDS CONTINUED

J. MAURY CLANCY INDIAN CAMPERSHIP FUND

This campership fund was created in 1971 to help provide funds to those American Indian Scouts needing assistance to attend resident camp. The fund was subsequently named in memory of long-time national committee member Maury Clancy, who contributed significantly to the Order. Mr. Clancy emphasized the significance of our nation's American Indian culture and worked to encourage the preservation of our American Indian heritage. Lodges may contribute to this fund through their section at will, thereby increasing the fund and enabling more camperships to be awarded.

NATIONAL SERVICE AWARD

The National Service Award was established in 1999 to recognize lodges in each region that have performed outstanding service, both in a qualitative and a quantitative sense, to their council.

OA SERVICE GRANT

One of the four-fold purposes of the Order of the Arrow is *to crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others*. It is with this spirit of cheerful service to others that the Order proudly offers the matching service grant program. For several years, the National Order of the Arrow Committee has provided matching service award grants for a limited number of projects.

RED ARROW AWARD

The Red Arrow award was created in 1967 to recognize individuals who are not members of the Order of the Arrow, for outstanding service to the Order. This attractive award, a red arrow and medallion superimposed on an engraved plaque, and a miniature charm for civilian wear, can only be awarded by action of the National Order of the Arrow Committee. Recommendations, by nomination form, should be sent to the national director.

THE VIGIL HONOR

The Vigil Honor is the highest honor that the Order of the Arrow can bestow upon its members for service to lodge, council, and Scouting. Membership cannot be won by a person's conscious endeavors.

Lodge Bylaws

Section I Name and Affiliation of Lodge

- A. The name of this lodge of the Order of the Arrow shall be Tecumseh Lodge #65, W.W.W.
- B. The lodge shall be affiliated with the Simon Kenton Council No. 441, Boy Scouts of America, and shall be under the supervision of the council camping committee and the administrative authority of its Scout Executive.
- C. The totem of this lodge shall be the panther headed comet.
- D. Lodge sashes shall only be worn at Order of the Arrow functions and courts of honor over the right shoulder in accordance with National Policy.
- E. The lodge shall be divided into as many chapters as there are districts and/or Service Areas in the Simon Kenton Council or a lesser number as may be directed by the lodge executive committee.
- F. Each chapter shall come under the supervision of the district camping committee and the district Scout Executive of the districts in which the chapter serves.

Section II Requirements and Procedure of Membership

- A. The requirements for membership in this lodge are as stated in the current national policy of the Order of the Arrow.
- B. Procedure for the Ordeal shall be as stated in current national policy of the Order of the Arrow.

Section III Lodge Administration

- A. The officers of this lodge shall be lodge chief, vice chief of administration, vice chief of activities, vice chief of chapters, lodge secretary, and lodge treasurer; these are elected officers and officers must be under 21 years of age for their entire term of office.
- B. The officers of each chapter must include chapter chief, chapter vice-chief, and chapter secretary. The office of chapter treasurer is optional. These are elected officers and must be under 21 years of age for their entire term of office.
- C. Lodge Officers shall be elected at the Fall Fellowship, which shall be held before January 1. Chapter Officers shall be elected after the Lodge elections, but before January 1. The terms of all officers, chapter and lodge, shall be from January 1 to December 31.
- D. The executive committee of this lodge shall be composed of the six elected officers, lodge committee chairmen and their advisers, chapter coordinators and their advisers, chapter chief and adviser of each chapter, all past lodge chiefs under 21, the lodge advisers, a member of the council camping committee, the Scout Executive and the Staff Adviser.
- E. The lodge and chapter advisers shall be appointed by the Scout Executive in consultation with the related camping committee chairmen.
- F. The Lodge Chief shall appoint, with the approval of the Lodge Executive Committee, the following standing committee chairmen and such special committees as may be required from time to time. All chairmen shall be under 21 years of age for their entire term of office, and shall be directly responsible to the lodge chief.

G. No person shall have more than one vote on the lodge executive committee even if they hold more than one voting position.

H. If the lodge chief resigns or is removed from office, the lodge vice-chief of administration shall become the new lodge chief within 10 days of his resignation or removal, subject to the approval of the lodge executive committee.

I. The lodge chief shall appoint any vacancies in any lodge office or committee chairmen within 15 days of their resignation or removal. Any new appointees shall be subject to the approval of the lodge executive committee.

Section IV Lodge Meetings

A. The executive committee of this lodge shall hold at least seven meetings a year.

B. Special meetings of the lodge executive committee or the lodge as a whole may be called at the pleasure of the lodge chief with the approval of the Scout Executive or by the Scout Executive.

C. Each meeting of the lodge shall be opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and the Obligation of the Order of the Arrow.

D. Members of the Order, 21 years of age or over, shall have no vote in any decisions of the lodge. Adult Arrow members shall serve as advisers to officers and committee members.

Section V Dues and Fees

A. There shall be a candidate induction fee approved annually by the lodge executive committee which shall be payable at the time of registration. For such fee, each new member shall receive :

1. A membership card with the current year's dues paid
2. An Order of the Arrow sash
3. A lodge pocket flap
4. An Order of the Arrow handbook
5. A certificate of their Ordeal completion
6. Food and program materials for their ordeal weekend
7. A lodge plan book containing general information about the lodge

- B. Current dues to this lodge shall be collected annually by the lodge membership committee (Dues year is January 1 to December 31). Current dues are \$20.00 for youth and adults due prior to January 1. After that date, a member shall be classified as inactive under Section F.
- C. In the development of the lodge annual budget, \$1 per paid registered chapter member, with a minimum of \$50.00, will be made available for chapter mailings, activities and service projects, with the chapter making up the difference. The number of paid, registered chapter members will be determined on December 31 preceeding the beginning of the new lodge year. Chapters shall submit an annual chapter budget at the beginning of the new lodge year. The chapter may come back to the Lodge Executive Committee for more money prior to expenditure. All approved bills will be paid by the Council Office. Unused funds revert to the Lodge at the end of the lodge year.
- D. Chapters may have fund raisers and earn money with approval of Lodge and Council. All funds must be kept in the Council accounts and will be accounted by the Lodge Treasurer. Chapter funds earned in such ways remain in the Chapter account and do not roll back at the end of the year.
- E. All lodge and chapter Order of the Arrow funds shall be handled by the Simon Kenton Council office and shall go through all normal accounting procedures used by the lodge and council.
- F. Inactive members may be restored to active status by paying five dollars (\$5.00) plus the current year's dues.
- G. Current member's of another lodge wishing to transfer their membership into this lodge shall pay the current year's dues only.
- H. The lodge will waive the current year's dues for any active military personnel, if requested in writing.
- I. The lodge budget year shall be the same as the lodge year.

Section VI

Brotherhood Membership

- A. Completion of Brotherhood Membership shall be in accordance with current national policy of the Order of the Arrow.

Section VII

The Vigil Honor

- A. Attainment of the Vigil Honor shall be in accordance with current national policy of the Order of the Arrow.

Section VIII

Amendments

- A. These rules shall be subject to amendments at any regular or special meeting of the lodge, provided, (1) such amendment has been submitted in writing to the executive committee at least one month prior to the lodge meeting, (2) that the executive committee by a two-thirds vote of the members present approves the proposed amendments, and (3) that due notice of the meeting has been sent to all active members of the lodge at least 10 days prior to such lodge meeting. A majority vote of the members present shall be required. All lodge rules must be in harmony with the current national policy of the Order of the Arrow and must be reviewed by an Ad Hoc committee during each odd-numbered year.



The Order of the Arrow, in its focus on service, has five high adventure programs at the national level that focus on conservation. Directions to our Council Camps

Camp Lazarus is located on US Rt 23 North of Columbus, roughly 3 miles south of Delaware and 9 Miles north of I-270. Watch for the sign on the west side of the road and turn into Camp Lazarus across from the Ohio Health Boulevard stoplight.

Camp Falling Rock is located off Rt. 79 N. about 15 minutes north of Newark, Ohio. From Columbus, take St Rt 161 E., which becomes St Rt 16 E through Newark. Take St Rt 79 N. (Cedar St. exit). About 11 miles north, there is a camp sign. Turn Left. Keep to the left over the bridge. Again follow the signs and turn left to go to the top of Camp (Summer Entrance) on Houdeschell Rd.

Camp Oyo is on St. Rt. 125, twelve miles west of Portsmouth. Take US Rt 52 West from Portsmouth, turn right on St Rt 125. Proceed 5 miles to the Camp on the right. If you pass Lake Roosevelt or the State Park Lodge, you've gone too far.

Camp Otter Run - From I-270, take US Rt 33 west through Marysville. Continue on US Rt 33 toward Bellfontaine from the route 245, 36, 4 split. From the split, continue on US Rt 33 toward Bellfontaine for 13.1 miles and you will exit onto St Rt 347. Go to the top of the ramp and turn left at the stop sign onto Rt. 347. Continue on Rt. 347, 1/2 mile to the T intersection. Turn right onto Logan County Road 144. Continue on Logan County Rd. 144 for 1 1/2 miles. Camp Otter Run will be on the right.

Your Tecumseh Lodge Dues

To maintain your membership in the Order of The Arrow and Tecumseh Lodge you need to pay your dues each year. If you are not a dues paid member you lose the right to call yourself a member of the Order of the Arrow. If you are not a member of the OA you also lose the right to wear the Lodge Flap or other symbols or patches for the OA. You must be registered in a Simon Kenton Council Scouting unit to be a member of Tecumseh Lodge.

When Do I Need To Pay My Dues?

Our Lodge year is from January 1st to December 31st, so your dues need to be paid at the beginning of each calendar year.

I'm a Newer Member - Weren't my dues included in my Ordeal fee?

If you took your Ordeal within the last year, your Ordeal fees included your dues through the end of the calendar year in which you took your Ordeal. You would next need to pay your dues at the beginning of the next calendar year.

A calendar year is from January 1st to December 31st.

How Can I Pay My Dues?

You can pay your dues several ways:

By Mail - using the paper dues form which can be found on the "Forms" page of our website or in our newsletters.

On Line - Just click on the "Pay Your Lodge Dues" link on our website.

In Person - You can pay in person at any lodge event or at our lodge booth at the University of Scouting.

I have not paid my dues for a long time, how can I become a member again?

If you have not paid dues for a while it's easier to join again than you think.

Just fill out the form as completely as possible, pay \$25.00 and we will re-instate you.

I know someone who would like to transfer into Tecumseh Lodge from another lodge, how can they do it?

All they need to do is click on the "Pay Your Lodge Dues" link on our website and follow the instructions for transferring. They can also fill out the paper dues form and send it in along with as much information about their previous membership as they can gather and we can transfer them into Tecumseh Lodge. We will contact their previous lodge to confirm their membership. The cost is only \$25.00. They must be registered with a unit in Simon Kenton Council to be a member of Tecumseh Lodge.
