



Get Ready for the 2022 National Order of the Arrow Conference! University of Tennessee, July 25th – 30th, 2022

NOAC is a national gathering of around 8,000 to 10,000 Arrowmen from nearly every Lodge in the nation. Once every couple of years, we get together for six days of fun, adventure, and learning. If you choose to go, you will find a large selection of activities ranging from Native American dancing and regalia to scuba and snorkeling. The best thing is YOU get to choose what you want to do and when you do it. Some of the great activities at NOAC include:

- Live stage shows
- Hundreds of training sessions on leadership at all levels in Scouting, Native American interests, performing ceremonies, high adventure activities, conservation, and much more
- Meet the Man events with the OA national officers, national committee, and others
- Adventure Central, with dozens of outdoor ideas and challenges (plus free swag!)
- Individual and team athletic competitions against other lodges from across the nation
- Ceremony competitions
- Patch trading, patch trading, and more patch trading
- Native American dancing and drumming competitions
- The OA Museum
- Founders Day, where lodges from all over set up games and displays of their local highlights

History Corner

The National Order of the Arrow Conference

The first National Order of the Arrow Conference, or NOAC, was held in 1948 at the University of Indiana in Bloomington. The event was officially called the 15th National Meeting, and was only later called the first NOAC when that name was adopted for future national gatherings. Before that time, the national meetings were intended only for lodge and national leaders. The 1948 NOAC was the first time that Arrowmen of all

levels from across the nation came together. Since then, NOAC has been held every two to three years, always on a university campus.

The OA's founder, E. Urner Goodman, gave the opening keynote address in 1948. A little more than 1,100 delegates from 146 different lodges attended, out of the 362 lodges in existence at that time, and it was announced that the Order of the Arrow was now an official program of the BSA. Also for the first time, the OA Distinguished Service Award was presented to those who had provided outstanding support of the OA at the national level.

NOAC has grown tremendously since 1948. Within a few years, the event averaged 3,000 to 4,000 delegates, and reached almost 7,000 in 1990 for the OA's 75th anniversary. The 2015 NOAC, celebrating 100 years of the Order of the Arrow, far exceeded everyone's expectations by topping 14,000 participants, and thousands more had to be turned away because there just wasn't room. Unfortunately, the 2020 NOAC also set a record – it was the first NOAC ever to be cancelled due to growing health concerns.

This July, the National Order of the Arrow Conference will be held for the 34th time, and it will be another groundbreaking event. For the first time in NOAC history there will be female youth participants, in addition to all of the incredible training, events, shows, swag, patch trading, and fellowship that have been a part of every NOAC since the beginning. There is still time to sign up – talk to a Lodge officer or Adviser today to learn more.

The 2022 Order of the Arrow Election Season is underway! Encourage your Troop/Crew/Ship to have the OA visit and host their election! We have over 40 units that our Chapters need to contact and visit. Help us and reach out to each Chapter's Leadership for information on how to assist the efforts to visit all the Units! Unit Order of the Arrow elections need to be completed by the end of February and all elected Scouts, and nominated adults, need to be entered into the spreadsheets for your Chapter and turned in along with the other documentation.

As the election season continues, please reach out if your Chapter needs Lodge assistance. Also, make sure to attend the LEC event on January 29th for further election details and election training. Remember to have a successful Order of the Arrow election, each Unit needs to make an Election Night Reservation, so please encourage Units to NOT WAIT until the last minute to hold their elections.

Lodge Committees

What is a Lodge Committee?

A Lodge Committee is a group of Arrowmen given responsibility for a specific task within the Lodge. Committees are run by Committee Chairmen, who report to the Lodge Officer their committee is under. Committees are a great way to learn about and get more involved in the Lodge.

Who can join?

Anyone who is a registered OA member can be part of a committee, including both youth and adults. Members also range from new Ordeal members to seasoned Vigil members.

How can I join?

There are multiple different ways to join a committee. The easiest way is to talk to or email a Lodge Officer or the Committee Chair. An alternative is to fill out this Committee Interest Form or find it on tecumseh65.org

Committee Descriptions

Lodge Chief

Honors - The Honors Committee is responsible for electing new Vigil Honor Candidates and helping with the induction process.

Health and Safety - The Health and Safety Committee is responsible for providing safety guidance for activities, making sure first aid kits are restocked for ordeals, helping the health officer at each event collect and process med forms, and informing everyone of who and where to go for first aid and emergencies.

Vice Chief of Administration

Elangomat - The Elangomat Chairman is responsible for the creation of an elangomat team and the utilization of the people within the team they create. The chairman is also responsible for the organization of elangomats and maintaining the use of elangomats throughout the entirety of the service hours. In addition to application skills, the chairman is responsible for recruitment and maintaining a consistent number of elangomats.

Brotherhood -The Brotherhood Chairmen is responsible for the development of a smooth and efficient Brotherhood experience that makes people enjoy and want to continue in the OA, while also assisting in other activities pertaining to ordeals and fellowships.

Ritual - The Ritual Chairman is responsible for the creation of the ritual team and leaders that will help create the new ritual hierarchy system. Ritual Chairman is a position designed to give advice, share experience, and delegate the different responsibilities held by other members on all of the ritual teams. Overall, the chairman's largest and main focus is on developing a skilled and capable ritual team for all 3 ceremony blocks; Pre-ordeal, Ordeal, and Brotherhood.

Vice Chief of Activities

Food Service - The Food Services Chairman is responsible for ensuring that food is prepared and ready to go and that there is youth assistance in the kitchen on all of our events.

Fellowships - The Fellowships Chairman works on the two large fellowships in order to ensure a fun and engaging opportunity for the Arrowmen. This position works closely with the Vice Chief of Activities in ensuring the preparation of all of the events including the activities at the end of the ordeals.

NOAC (Ad Hoc) - The NOAC Chairman is the go-to youth on the planning and execution of the trip to NOAC.

Dance Team (Ad Hoc) - The Dance Team Chairman is the focal point of the dance team and helps to make sure that we have a team of dancers everywhere that it is needed.

Vice Chief of Chapters

Membership - The Membership Committee supports the Chapters' efforts to maintain and increase Arrowman membership. The Membership Committee helps the Chapters plan events and maintain Arrowman involvement within the Chapters. The Membership Committee is in direct communication with each Chapter Secretary for Chapter attendance and for assistance with event planning and guided information.

Elections/Visitation - The Elections/Visitation Committee supports the Chapters and the Lodge by performing the Unit elections to induct OA Candidates. The Elections/Visitation Committee attends each Unit's Order of the Arrow election during the beginning of each year and performs the informational session prior to their Unit Election. During the rest of the year, the Elections/Visitation Committee will attend Unit meetings to continue to provide the Units with OA information, OA event happenings, and keeping the OA front and center with each Unit.

Secretary

Communication - The Communication Committee handles all of the Lodge communications, including the newsletter, social media, website, emails, and anything else the gets information out to the Lodge.

Registration - The Registration Committee checks in attendees to events. During Ordeals, the committee supplies the Ordeal candidate attendance sheet and also play a role in correcting personal contact information for members.

Historian (Ad Hoc) - The Historian Committee records events that have happened in the Lodge in the past as well as the present. The committee develops the Lodge History website, collects historical objects, documents events through pictures and recaps, and creates an end-of-year yearbook summarizing what happened in the Lodge in that year.

Treasurer

Budgets - The Budgets Committee oversees the budgets and informs the lodge leadership team on the budget breakdown for each event. At the end of the event, the committee tracks and reports the actual amounts spent and the committee's effect on the overall budget. The committee also keeps track of the budgets and spending of each Chapter from a Lodge perspective.

Trading Post - The Trading Post Committee makes sure at least one member of the committee is available to help set up, run and tear down the trading post. The trading post is open around meal times and free time at every Lodge event. The committee also helps design new patches and the trading post coupons for the newsletter.



2021 Gold Arrowman Award



We are excited to announce a new award that is being offered this year to all our members. The Gold Arrowman is an award designed to recognize members that are active in the Lodge and promote the OA in their units. This award is designed to be earned during the course of one calendar year. Recipients of this award will receive a unique lodge flap at our annual awards banquet. In order to receive the Gold Arrowman award you need to complete the five requirements listed below, get them initialed, sign and turn in the form.

Complete all five of the following requirements:
1. Attend one Training event (LLD or Forum)
2. Do one of the Following: A. For Ordeal candidates (new members who take their Ordeal in 2021), complete your Ordea and Serve at one other Ordeal (Elangomat, Kitchen, Ritual, Chairman or Officer/Adviser)
B. For Ordeal members who took their Ordeal prior to 2021, earn Brotherhood and serve at one other Ordeal (Elangomat, Kitchen, Ritual, Chairman or Officer/Adviser)
C. For Brotherhood/Vigil Members – Serve at two Ordeals as an Elangomat, Kitchen help, Ritual team member, Lodge Committee/Chairman or as a Lodge Officer/Adviser
3. Attend one Fellowship (Spring/Fall)
4. Discuss Opportunities Within the Lodge with an Officer/Adviser
5. Talk to your unit about the opportunities within the OA and encourage inactive members to attend a Lodge event

Have You Paid Your 2022 Tecumseh Lodge Dues?

To maintain your membership in the Order of The Arrow and Tecumseh Lodge, you need to pay your dues each year. If you are not a dues paid member, you lose the right to call yourself a member of the Order of the Arrow. If you are not a member of the OA, you also lose the right to wear the Lodge Flap or other symbols or patches for the OA. You must be registered in a Simon Kenton Council Scouting unit to be a member of Tecumseh Lodge.

When do I need to pay my dues?

Our Lodge year is from January 1st to December 31st each year, so your dues need to be paid at the beginning of each calendar year.

I'm a Newer Member - Weren't my dues included in my Ordeal fee?

If you took your Ordeal in 2021, your Ordeal fees included your dues through the end of that calendar year.

You would next need to pay your dues at the beginning of the next calendar year (in 2022).

In Person - You can pay in person at any lodge event or at our lodge booth at the University of Scouting
